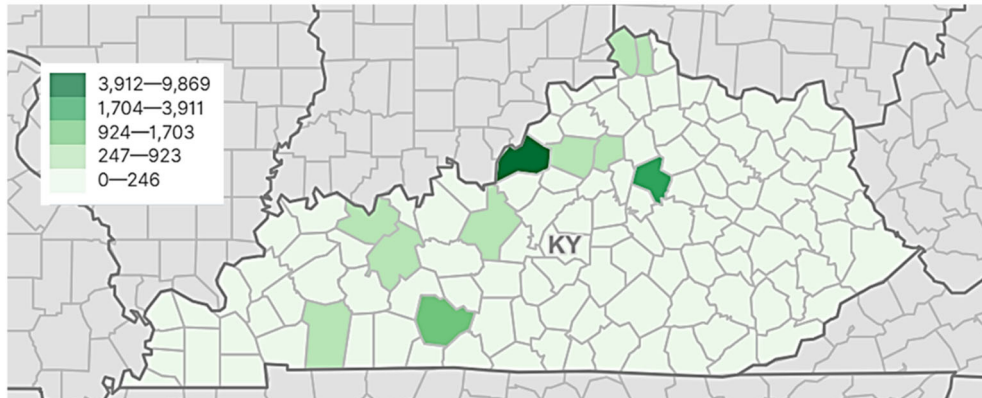

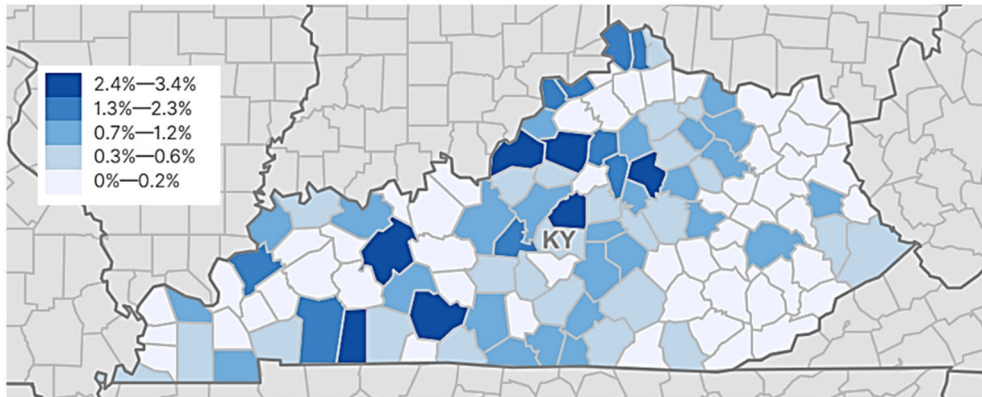
#### Number of Limited-English Speaking Households

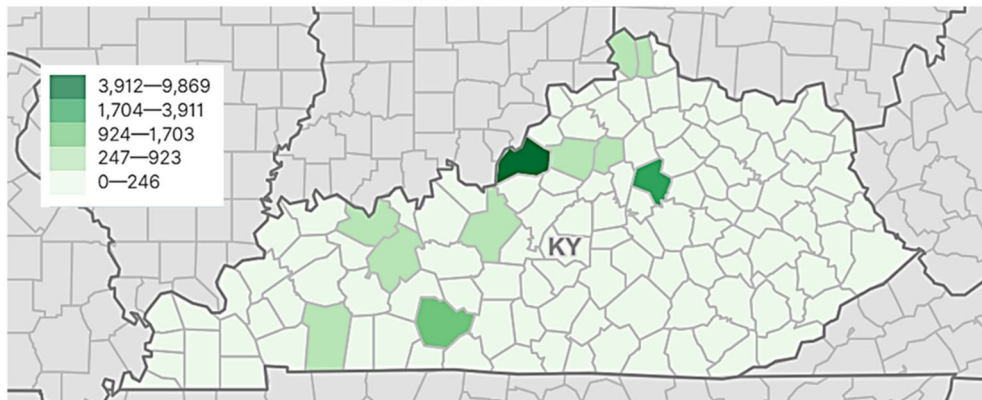

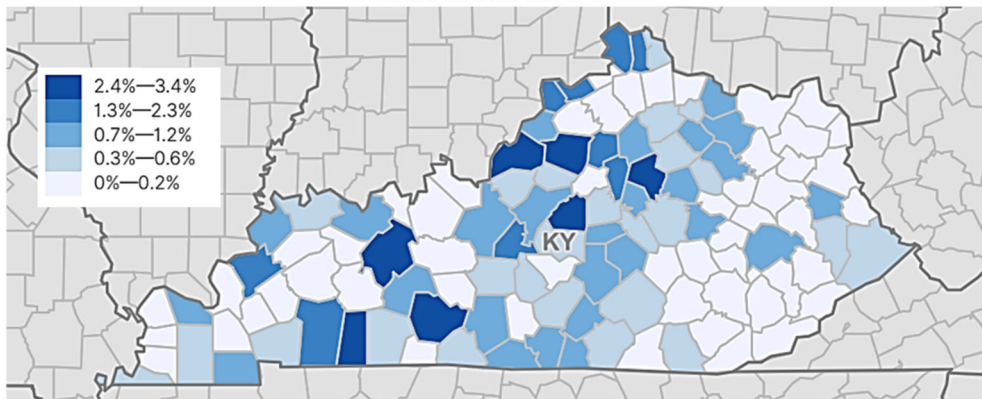
#### Number of Limited-English Speaking Households

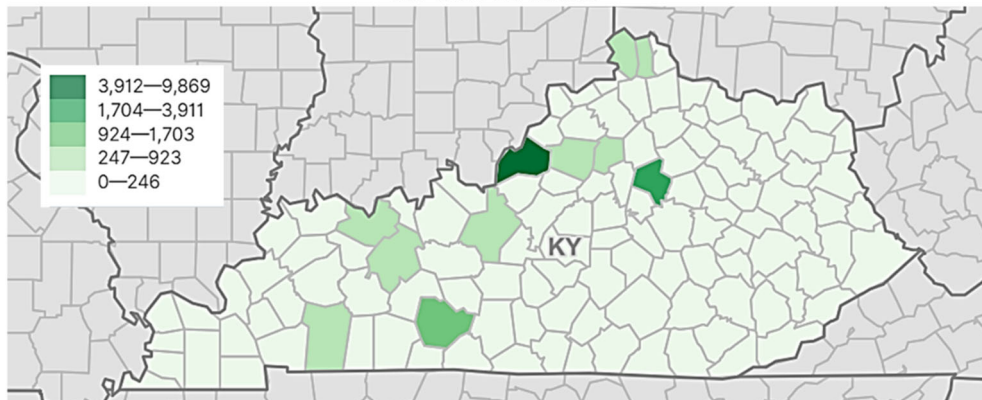

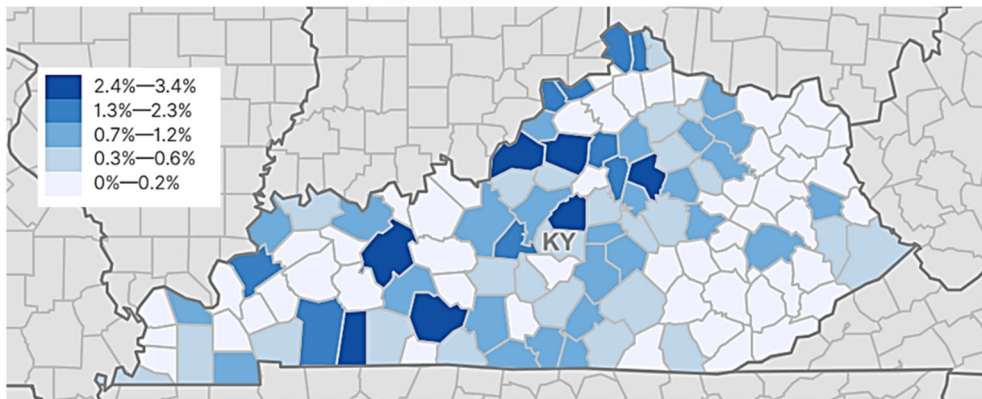
#### Number of Limited-English Speaking Households

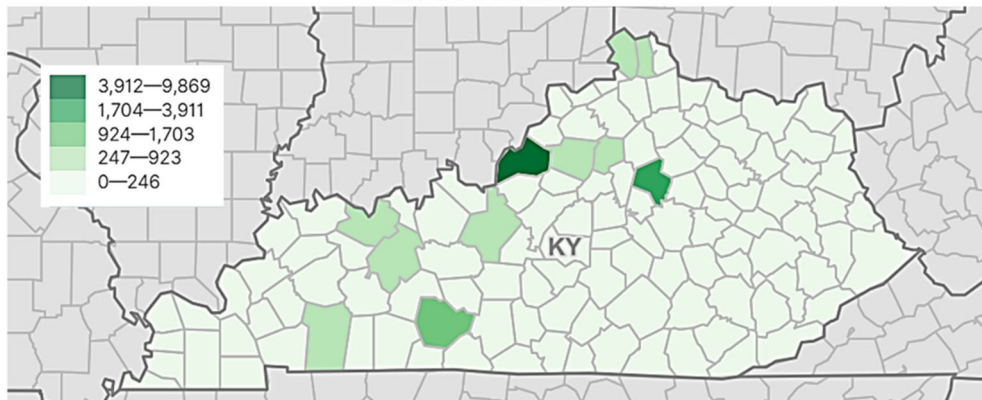

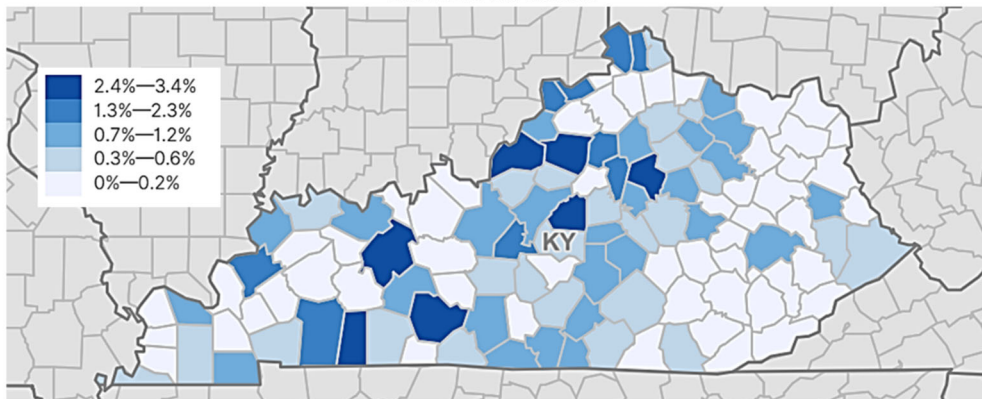
### Number of Limited-English Speaking Households

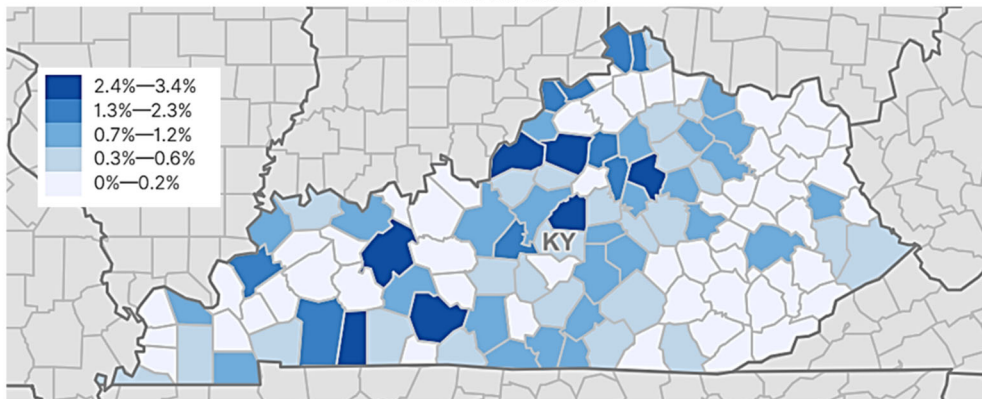
#### Number of Limited-English Speaking Households

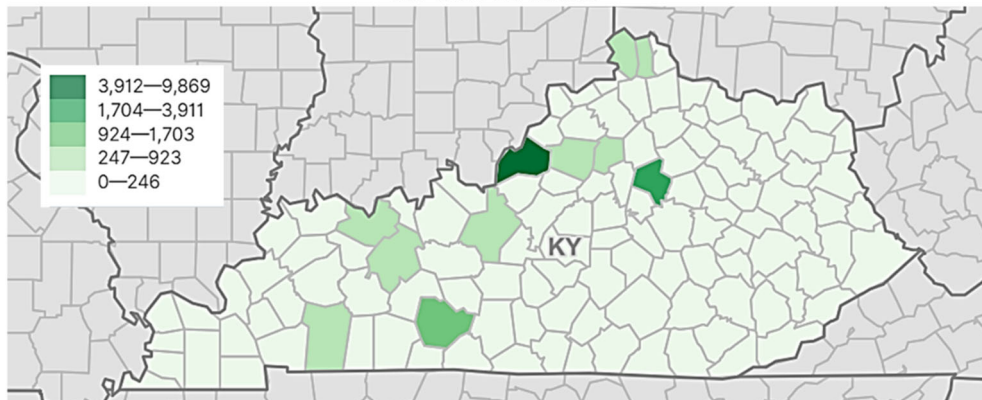

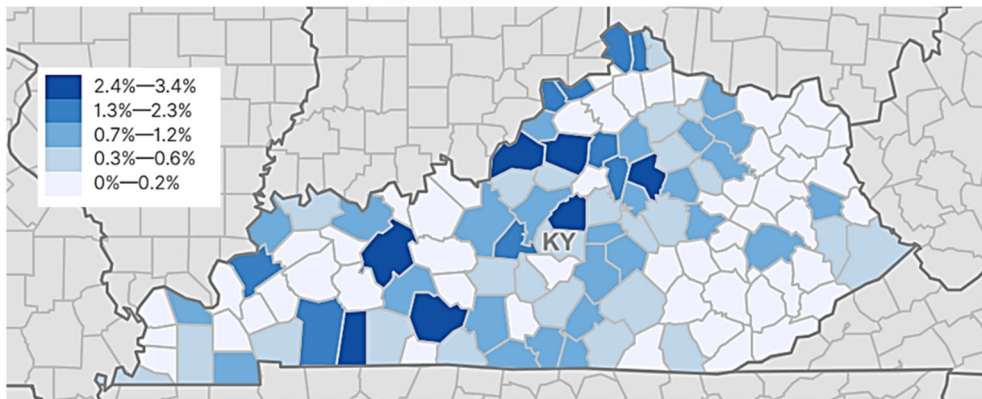
#### Number of Limited-English Speaking Households

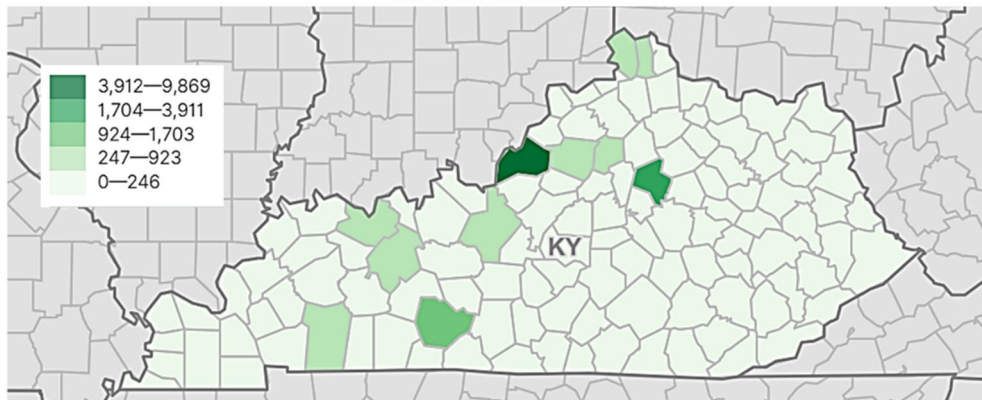

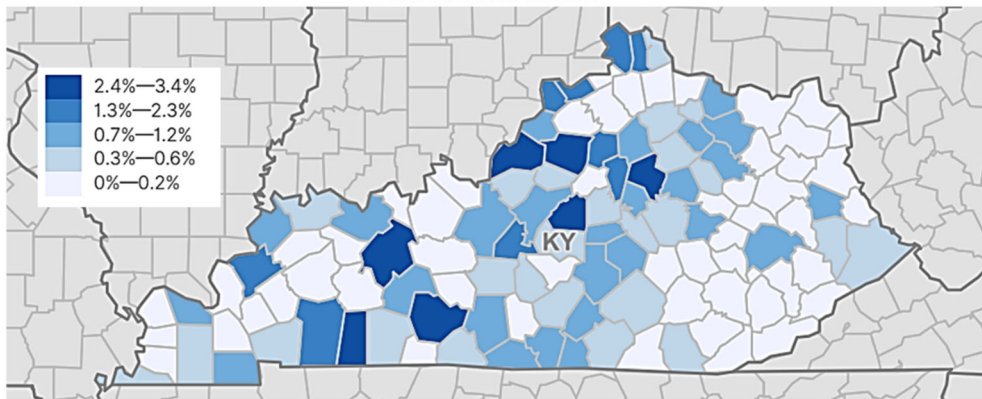
#### Number of Limited-English Speaking Households

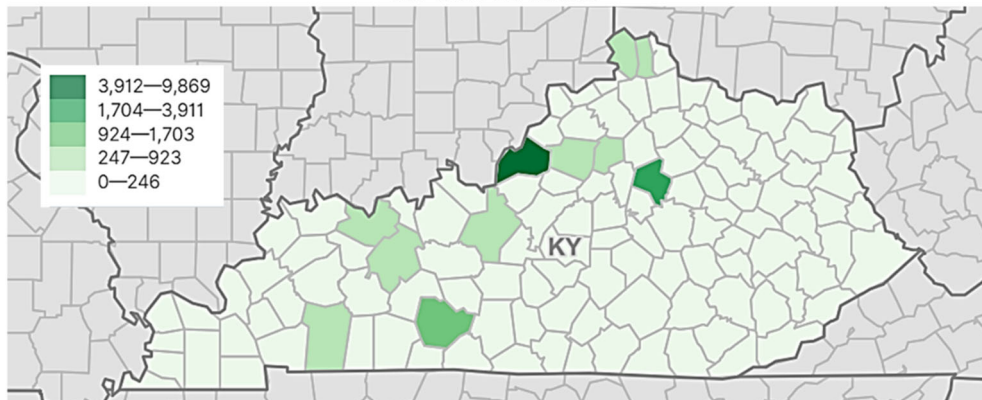

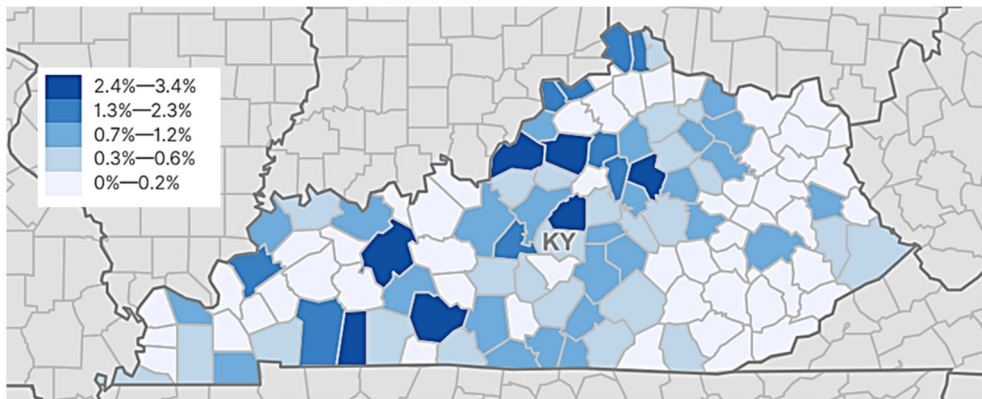
#### Number of Limited-English Speaking Households

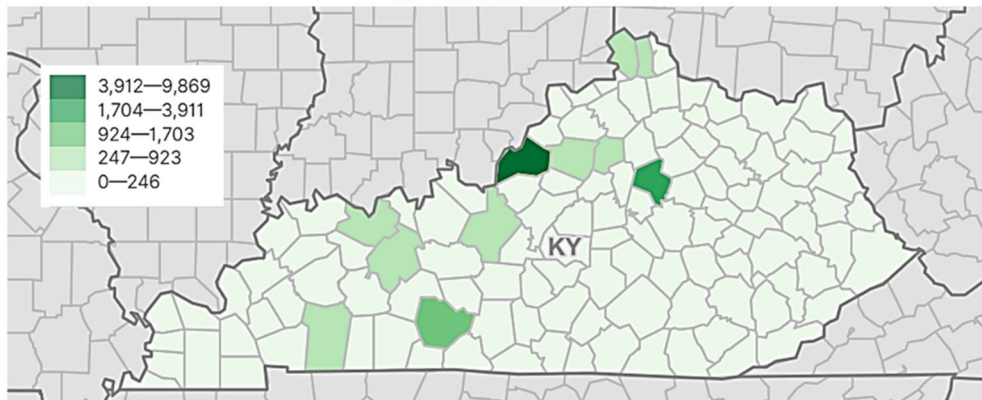

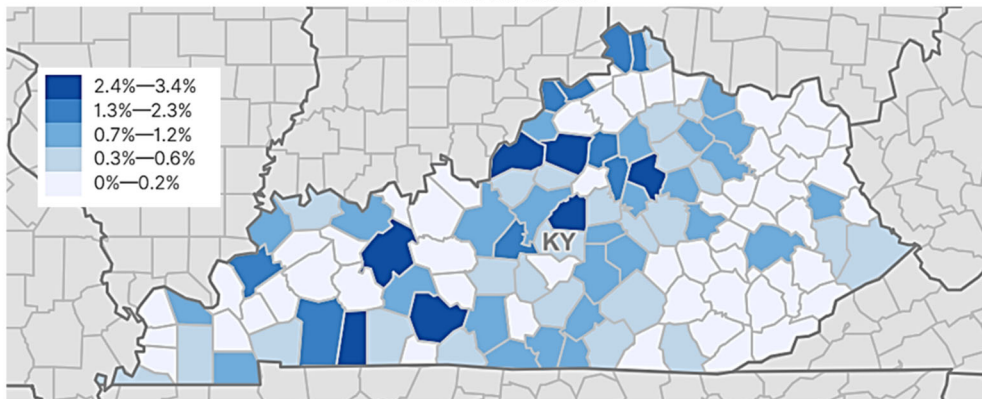
#### Number of Limited-English Speaking Households
