## HONORARY DOCTORATE AWARDED

Minnie Miller Brown, was awarded an Honorary Doctorate by the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, at the May 1989 Commencement ceremonies.

She is a pioneer in innovative approaches to alleviating rural poverty and malnutrition. Her career has included 35 years of service with the N.C. Agricultural Extension Service as a county, district and state agent. She also was professor of extension at North Carolina State University.

As a member of a 1968 national task force for the Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program, Minnie Miller Brown helped plan a national food and nutrition program for low-income families.

Other honors include the Distinguished Service to Rural Life Award from the Rural Sociological Society in 1987, the Winthrop Rockefeller Award for Distinguished Rural Service from the National Rural Center in 1980, and the Award for Superior Service by the U.S. Department of Agriculture in 1966.
